Face Book

During the current topic on Keeping Ourselves Safe, it has come to our attention that many children have access to or have Face Book pages. Although a very useful site, there are many dangers with Face Book that younger people may not understand. Children less than 13 years of age are not permitted to have a face book page. It is also recommended that children 13 years or older ask their parents for permission before sending any information about themselves over the internet.

Thanks to the parents who have given us feedback about the Keeping Ourselves Programme. It is always important that we evaluate programmes that we run and your thoughts are important to us.

Measles

The Ministry of Health has asked that we bring the following information to your attention;

The measles outbreaks in Auckland and Waikato are mainly affecting unimmunised school children.

By 8 August, 175 measles cases had been reported this year, including 19 who needed hospital treatment. Most cases were in the Auckland region, although 24 cases were reported in Hawke's Bay this year. In the past week, 12 cases have been reported in the Waikato region, mainly around Te Awamutu.

Measles symptoms

Measles is a highly infectious disease and is more serious than many people realise. Symptoms include fever, cough, red eyes and a runny nose, and then a rash which develops after about three days. Complications can include middle ear infections, pneumonia, and, more rarely, encephalitis or brain inflammation. About one in ten people infected need to be hospitalised.

The best measles prevention is the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine which is free for all New Zealand children.

As a school, we are currently checking our immunization records. However, if you are aware that your child's immunizations are not up to date, this might be a good time to give this due consideration.

If you have chosen not to immunize your children please advise the school so that records can be noted accordingly.
